Acorn Schools work

Back to School!

Having had to stop our schools work when schools were shut, we have been back to a full programme in the current academic year. Indeed we have never been busier.

Acorn welcomed by more schools

We have been welcomed into 3 schools new to Acorn: Worthing High, Bohunt and Sion. So now we visit a total of 10 schools in the Worthing area – more than ever before.

Double the lessons at Durrington!

In addition Durrington High were so keen to ensure that a year group did not miss out on the sessions delivered by Acorn that they asked us to cover both years 10 and 11 – a total of 26 x 1 hour sessions delivered at just one school!

Acorn Counselling

Counselling options available to clients

We have continued to offer clients a choice of face to face, telephone or online counselling.

Who we helped

221 hours of counselling in 2021

63 clients made contact with us during the year of which 37 came to appointments. 2 of these were for crisis pregnancy counselling, 5 for initial assessments only, with some 30 clients seen for up to 10 weeks of pregnancy loss counselling sessions each (predominantly miscarriage and abortion). In total 221 x 1 hour sessions with clients were held.

How did they find Acorn?

Over the past year the main sources of referral have been:

35% Website/social media 19% Time to Talk 19% Friend

It is interesting to note that over the last 4 years whilst the overall number of clients seen has stayed roughly similar the source of referrals has changed with for instance 3 times as many people coming as a result of the website/social media now compared with 4 years ago. Whilst we continue to seek referrals from all sources we need to be constantly mindful of the changes in ways people access advice and seek help and ensure the route to finding Acorn is as easy as possible.

Pregnancy counselling team

Finance 📀

Thanks to our financial supporters

Whilst our income dropped in the past year, this was largely due to a reduction in grant income which had been exceptionally high in the previous year. We did however receive grants from Sussex Community Foundation and Green Hills Christian Trust and we are grateful to both these organisations. We do appreciate everyone who gives to Acorn especially those who do so on a regular basis.

New branding expenditure

The increase in expenditure was planned with costs relating to marketing – the new branding, website and videos – being funded out of grant money provided the previous year. The deficit for the year was largely caused by this timing issue.

We are also grateful to our Treasurer, Bookkeeper and Independent Examiner

Our Treasurer Patrick Woodward has decided to remain in this role having been greatly assisted this year by a new member of the finance team Debbie Squires an experienced bookkeeper. We are grateful to them both and to Andrew Kean our independent examiner.





Centre Management

Angela Geach has continued to work as our part time (12 hours per week) employed member of staff. This is a key role amongst other things being the first point of contact for any client. We are grateful for Angela's caring manner, creativity, diligence and commitment.





Five trustees

During the year there have been 5 trustees – my co trustees being Patrick Woodward, Gillian Woodward and Pam Denman and the trustees co-opted Paul Cross to the role as well. There will be a resolution to appoint Paul formally as a trustee at the AGM.

Official bodies

Acorn continues to be registered with the Fundraising Regulator and remains a member of the National Council of Voluntary Organisations and of the British Association of Counselling & Psychotherapy.



Acorn video stars on the new-look website!

We have completed our rebranding with a refreshed website and range of leaflets. Our schools and counselling volunteers have also recorded professionally produced videos to help a wider audience understand the work – they are available on the website.

Keeping everyone up to date

Our monthly mailing continues to keep supporters up to date and our quarterly newsletters available for download from the website are also sent to former clients who wish to keep in touch.

We continue to keep the church community of Worthing informed about the work with regular updates sent to ministers.

Our social media activity is growing – Acorn is on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram – and one client came to us this year as a result of a third party podcast she had heard.

The monthly prayer meetings are attended by a committed core group and we are seeking to increase prayer activity in the coming year using a WhatsApp group.

We remain closely in touch with other similar West Sussex-based pregnancy counselling groups but also promote the work of Acorn through other groups including a local bereavement forum.



Client ambassador

Users of the services we provide are our best ambassadors. One client was so impressed with the counselling she received that she took our leaflets into her local GP surgery to make sure they referred other patients as she was so concerned that they hadn't signposted her to Acorn. She then agreed to write an article for Inside Worthing which has appeared in the April edition circulated to over 45,000 homes in the Worthing area and we have already had a referral as a result.
